Daily Dosage

Start Small - Give time for your dog to adjust to coconut oil



1/4 teaspoon per day for small dogs and puppies 1 teaspoon for large dogs, or even just a dab if your dog's constitution is sensitive.

General VCO Daily Dosage



About 1 teaspoon per 10 pounds of body weight daily Or about 1 tablespoon per 30 pounds

Coconut oil on Skin



For good results, apply to the skin and let the oil absorb for about five minutes. After the pply and a very light rinse. If you feel you haven't removed the excess oil, finish up with a light application of shampoo and another quick rinse.

Give him a nice bath



Melt about 2 tablespoons of coconut oil into a cup of hot water. Once you've finished the shampooing portion of the bath, refill it with clean lukewarm water and add in the melted oil. Using a cup or jug, pour this oil and water mixture over your dog's body and rub it into his skin. Not only will with soothe and moisturize your dog's skin and give him a healthier looking coat, he'll smell yummy!
